



TOBACCO FREE FLORIDA offers a number of **FREE resources** to help smokers quit.

- These services are available at no cost to tobacco users to help them succeed today

**If medically appropriate and 18 years of age or older.*

PREEMPTION

This part expressly preempts regulation of smoking to the state and supersedes any municipal or county ordinance on the subject; however, school districts may further restrict smoking by persons on school district property (s. 386.209, F.S.).

PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT IN MASS TRANSPORTATION TERMINALS

Announcements about the FCIAA shall be made regularly over public address systems in terminals of public transportation carriers located in metropolitan areas with populations of over 230,000. The announcements shall be made at least every 30 minutes in appropriate languages. The announcement must include a statement that Florida is a clean air state and smoking is not allowed except as provided in this section (s. 386.211, F.S.).

THE FLORIDA CLEAN INDOOR AIR ACT (FCIAA)

Chapter 386, Florida Statutes

The purpose of the **Florida Clean Indoor Air Act (FCIAA)** is to protect people from the health hazards of secondhand smoke and to implement the Florida health initiative in s. 20, Art. X of the State Constitution.

PROHIBITION

A person may not smoke in an enclosed indoor workplace (s. 386.204, F.S.).

“**Enclosed Indoor Workplace**” means any place where one or more persons engage in work, and which is predominantly or totally bounded on all sides and above by physical barriers. A place is “predominantly” bounded by physical barriers at any time when both conditions exist:

- a) It is more than 50% covered from above by a physical barrier that excludes rain, and
- b) More than 50% of the combined surface area is covered by solid surfaces that block airflow

POSTING OF SIGNS

The following places are required to post signs if smoking is permitted:

- Licensed Stand-Alone Bar
- Customs Smoking Room
- Smoking Cessation Program
- Medical or Scientific Research Program

REQUIRING POLICIES

The proprietor or other person in charge of an enclosed indoor workplace must develop and implement a policy regarding the smoking prohibition (s. 386.206(1), F. S.).

Specific Exceptions: Tobacco smoking may be permitted in the following places:

- **Private Residence**
as defined in s. 386.2045(1), F.S.
- **Retail Tobacco Shop**
as defined in s. 386.203(8), F.S.
- **Designated Smoking Guest Room**
as defined in s. 386.203(4), F.S.
- **Stand-Alone Bar**
as defined in s. 386.203(11), F.S.
- **Smoking Cessation Program, Medical** or Scientific Research as defined in s. 386.2045(5), F. S.
- **Customs Smoking Room**
subject to restrictions contained in s. 386.205, F.S.
- **Membership Association**
as defined in s. 386.203(13), F.S., and provided that non-commercial activities and all work performed is done by members of the membership association.

ADMINISTRATION & ENFORCEMENT

The Department of Health (DOH) and the Department of Business & Professional Regulation (DBPR) are responsible for enforcing the FCIAA.

The following are examples of places the Department of Health has treated as enclosed indoor workplaces:

- Shopping Mall
- Educational Facility
- Health Care Facility
- Adult / Child Care Center
- Office Complex
- Convenience Store
- Public & Private Workplace
- Auditorium / Theater

DBPR shall enforce the FCIAA in the following workplaces if applicable:

- Restaurant
- Bowling Center
- Stand-Alone Bar
- Dog / Horse Track
- Civic & Fraternal Organizations
- Casino Ship
- Billiard
- Bingo Hall
- Jai Alai
